Janet Palsley, reading from her new historical novel, WHITE ROSE REBEL. (Historical fiction set during the Jacobite rebellion).

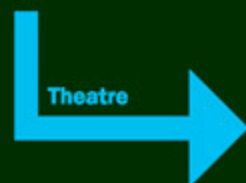

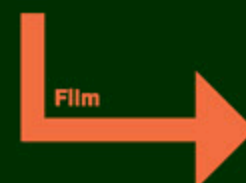
Join hopscotch for an hour of Sainly storytelling and flag flapping frolics, suitable for age 7-12 years.
